Real Change:

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- 1. God requires sinners to be changed. Ps. 51:6, 7, 10; Isa. 1:16-18.
- 2. From an <u>old man</u> we are to become a <u>new man</u>. Eph. 4:22-24.
- 3. From a <u>sinful heart</u> to a <u>new heart</u>. Eze. 11:19.
- 4. From sinful thoughts to new holy thoughts. Acts. 8:21, 22.
- 5. From <u>idols</u> in the heart, to <u>God</u> in the heart. (Eze. 36:25; 1 Jn. 5:20, 21).
- 6. From sinful works to works that God had foreordained we should walk in. (Col. 1:21; Eph. 2:10).
- 7. This change is called <u>Justification</u> or the washing of regeneration. Tit. 3:5-7.
- We are told that this Justification or Sanctification or washing of regeneration had <u>changed</u> some people so that they ceased the sins they did. This is real change. 1 Cor. 6:9-11.
- 9. With the old man dead, this change, cause us to cease from sins. Rom. 6:6, 7.
- 10. All this shows us that a <u>foundational change</u> must take place in conversion. Jam. 5:19, 20.
- 11. But sometimes people undergo a <u>superficial change</u> in different ways:
 - a. We cannot make ourselves righteous, so any such "change" is merely <u>outward</u> and not <u>inward</u>. Rom. 4:1, 2, 4.
- 12. We <u>cannot</u> save ourselves.
 - a. So any self-done reformation motivated by our own thought-up knowledge is only ethics, it is only good works, and that cannot save us because there is no <u>real</u> <u>change</u>. Matt. 23:27, 28.
 - b. The Jews sought to change themselves by doing the works of the Law, but this itself; was <u>self-caused</u>, so they were still breaking the Law. Rom. 9:31, 32.
- 13. <u>Fundamental change</u> is based upon certain <u>realities</u>.
 - a. There are only <u>two</u> existing realities in the universe.

- i. God.
- ii. Creation.
- b. Thus <u>change</u> can only move from <u>God</u> to <u>creation</u> or from <u>creation</u> to <u>God</u> nowhere else.
- 14. The movement from God to creation or creation to God can only take place in the realm of <u>values-estimation</u>, not in substantial reality.
 - a. Either God is wrongly esteemed as Creation.
 - b. Or creation is wrongly esteemed as God.
 - c. Or God and creation are esteemed as both creation.
 - d. Or God and creation are esteemed both as God.
 - e. This latter position is the same as saying that creation is God with God.
- 15. The idea that creation is God with God is the <u>first fundamental change</u>, brought by Lucifer, that; came into God's sinfree universe. Isa. 14:12-14.
- 16. The idea that <u>creation is God with God</u> is the fundamental change that Lucifer brought upon the earth. Gen. 3:1-5.
- 17. What were these changes? They were "<u>moral</u>" (meaning "right") changes. They were changes as to what is <u>right</u> and what was not <u>right</u> or <u>wrong</u>.
 - a. The <u>change</u> was from <u>God being God alone</u> to <u>creation being God with God</u>.
 - b. The <u>change</u> was from creation being <u>creation only</u>, to now being <u>God</u> while as yet being creation.
- 18. God has allowed this fallacy of Lucifer to play out on the earth, where we have a <u>false</u> <u>change</u>, but a real change in <u>value estimation</u>, to take place. He has allowed man to take a creation a piece of wood and change it into a God with God. Isa. 44:9, 10, 13-15, 17.
- 19. While the change can <u>never</u> be real for creation can never become God—the change in <u>mental values estimation</u> has occurred. This truly is a <u>foundational</u> change. Isa. 44:18-20.
- 20. In short, the <u>real change</u> that entered into the sinfree universe at the <u>first</u>; was the <u>mentally</u> making of creation as God with God. Rom. 1:20-23, 25.
- 21. <u>Pantheism</u>, the teaching or concept that creation is God with God, thus represents the <u>first</u> real change, and an evil change, that entered into God's sinfree universe. Gal. 3:5.

- Thus, on a sinful earth, everything that occurs says that creation (man also) is his <u>own</u>
 <u>saviour</u>, thus creation is God with God; this is not able to cause any real self-change. Eph.
 2:8, 9.
- 23. Anything that comes from man or <u>his own ability</u> states that Justification is by works, making man his own saviour. This is claiming that creation is God with God, and therefore does not represent <u>real change</u> in any false religion. Rom. 4:1, 2, 4.
- Any, religion with any false god is still worshipping <u>creation</u> as God with God. Ps. 96:4,
 5.
- However, Jesus said that the <u>change</u> must <u>first</u> begin <u>within</u> the <u>heart</u> of man. Matt. 23:25, 26.
- 26. The <u>real fundamental change</u> that takes place in the mind/heart of the justified person is the <u>values estimation</u> in the heart. Idols (creation), is removed from being <u>esteemed</u> as God with God, and <u>God</u> is placed within the mind as <u>God alone</u>. (Eze. 14:6; Eze. 36:25-27).
- 27. A knowledge claiming creation as God with God is destroyed from in the <u>mental value</u> <u>system</u> through a supplemented <u>knowledge</u> called the Faith of Jesus that presents <u>YHWH</u> <u>as God alone</u>. (Isa. 40:9; Isa. 53:11; Jn. 1:18).
- 28. The change is in the <u>mental holding</u> of creation as God with <u>God to God as God alone</u> instead. 1 Thess. 1:9.
- 29. Thus <u>real change</u>, <u>genuine change</u> that makes the difference is the <u>holiness of God</u> being <u>philosophically</u> praised <u>in</u> men's heart or in their <u>mental value estimation</u>. (1 Thess. 4:7; 1 Thess. 3:13); Eph. 4:24.
- 30. In conclusion, the <u>change</u> is from <u>creation as God with God</u> to <u>God as God alone</u>. (Isa. 42:8; 1 Sam. 2:2).
